BENEVOLENT FUND



PRE CONSECRATION

The Formation of the Lodge was under discussion for a long time but finally the band of Brothers were able to get their full compliment to complete the crew and sail the craft under the title of WALNUT TREE. This title was derived from the area in Dagenham where the idea was first conceived by several Brothers who came down from London to commence the devolopment of the Becontree Estate for the L.C.C. and in a field shown on the Tithe Maps as the Walnut Tree Field with a frontage in Green Lane. A temporary building was erected in this field as an office, and the discussions on the formation of the Lodge took place there, they were joined by some Brethren from the Dagenham Council staff and with a fair sprinkling of Brethren from other sources who were brought in to keep the Craft on an even keel the Lodge was duly Consecrated by the R.Wor. the Pro. Grand Master, for Essex, on the 15th of October 1935 at the Lord Lambourne, Masonic Temple. Romford, under the guidance of W.Bro H. N. Crowe, P.P.G.W. who was a past Master of the Sponsoring Lodge, (the Lodge of Old Friendship No. 3907.

CHARITIES

Brethren if you are observant you will see this important question falls on the Centre pages of this short history this is not by chance it is by design.

It is to symbolise the Centre Pin of Freemasonry which is Charity our great Craft revolves to a great extent round this Symbol; as we all agreed when we were admitted into the Craft to support the Charities. The total amount that the Lodge and the L.O.I have contributed is nearly Two Thousand Pounds our outstanding effort was the appeal of the Royal Masonic Inst. for Boys, in 1951. when the R.Wor. Prov Grand Master for Essex Sir Frederick Senier. was President at the 153rd. Anniversary Festival the total from the Province was £132.486 18 8 the total for this Lodge was £687 12 8 which was largely due to the untiring effort of our then Almoner W.Bro H. E. Stratton P.P.G.W Many Past Masters have Sponsored the other Charities during the year of office, Last years effort was on behalf of the R.M.H. this Charity needs all the support that we can give it at the present as it has an extensive building programme in progress and when completed will increase its accommodation by 50per cent the new wing will cost £700,000 to complete.

Special reference must be made of the very fine effort of the Lodge of Instruction for the wonderful way that they have supported the charities with the proceeds of their Charity boxes, by the end of this season they expect to reach a total of £200.

REPORT of the CONSECRATION Meeting held on the 15th October 1935, at the Lord Lambourne Masonic Hall, Romford.

The Lodge was opened in due form by W.Bro. H. J. Goodwin, Provincial Grand Secretary.

The Right Worshipful the Grand Master, Brig.Gen. Sir. Richard Colvin. K.G.B. accompanied by the Provincial Grand Officers entered in procession.

The R.Wor. Prov. Grand Master, took the Chair and appointed the Officers

The Provincial Grand Secretary read the Warrant and the Founders having signified their approval of the Officers named therein the Lodge was duly Consecrated.

The R.Wor. Prov. Grand Master, vacated the Chair in favour of W.Bro H. J. Goodwin, who proceeded with the Ceremony and Installed W.Bro. H. N. Crowe as First Master.

It was Proposed by W.Bro. Harrington, and Secon ed by Bro. I. A. Mason, and carried unanimously that the Election of Treasurer be left in the hands of the Worshipful Master.

It was proposed by Bro E. J. E. Gage, Seconded by W.Bro. L. R. S. Webster and carried unamimously that W.Bro H. O. Greene P.D.S.G.W. be elected as Tyler.

The W.Master then appointed his Officers

The addresses to the Master, Wardens, and Brethren, were very ably rendered by the P.G.D. of Ceremonies.

It was Proposed by Bro. H. W. Aimes and Seconded by W.Bro Emberson and carried unanimously that W.Bro. Stratton be elected as Charity representative.

It was proposed by Bro. H. W. Amies. Seconded by Bro. A. E. Stickland and carried unanimously that the Committee for the Framing of the Bye Laws should consist of the W.Master acting I.P.M. Senior and Junior Wardens; Treasurer; Secretary; and Director of Ceremonies.

It was proposed by the W.Master; and Seconded by Bro. I. A. Mason and carried unanimously that all the Consecrating Officers be elected Honorary Members of the Lodge. This was accepted by the R.Wor. Provincial Grand Master on behalf of the Consecrating Officers with thanks and all good wishes to the W.M. for the Prosperity of the Lodge.

The meeting was well attended by the Provincial Officers. Masters and Brethren as recorded in the Minutes the whole company numbered Sixty Six including Thirty Nine Visitors.

In its short existence the Association has allocated nearly £200 to various Charitable Organisations, but there are many demands that are still worthy of our efforts.

LANDMARKS

Our first home was the Lord Lambourn Masonic Temple Romford where the Lodge was Consecrated, it was a most imposing Building and had without doubt the finest Temple outside London, the building was erected through the foresight of prominent Masons in the Province, but alas in 1941 it was taken over by the Government for the use of the Forces which meant that all Lodges meeting here had to seek other accommodation which took us finally to the Seven Kings Hotel, where we first met on the 5th February 1941 this was entirely different to our previous home but we carried on here under adverse conditions until 1946. The only Music that was available was a Piano so at each meeting W.Bro H. V. Morgan had an organ conveyed from his home and collected the following day at his own expense. In February 1946 we were invited by Canon Elvin, P.A.G.Chap the Vicar of Saint Michaels, Gidea Park, to hold our meetings in the Parish hall, with other Lodges in the Province we contributed towards the cost of furnishing but our stay was very short as we found it very uncomfortable in the Winter. The design of this building was carried out by our Treasurer W.Bro E. Meredith, P.P.G.D., to be used for Badminton. Finally we moved to our present home the Chingford Masonic Hall, where we are all very happy.

SCHOOL OF INSTRUCTION

This came into being following pre Consecration Meeting, and as a School of Instruction with W.Bro. A. E. Gear P.M., P.P.A.G, of Wks at St. Peters, Church Hall. Becontree as Secretary, it was here that W.Bro J. A. Mallard, and Bro R. W. Hellings had their first introduction to Masonry, they where taken to this hall for an interview and on arrival with four others were shown into the Toilet to wait. All saw the somewhat funny side of this. In 1938 the school was able to move to more suitable accommodation at the Eastwood Club Goodmayes the condition here was ideal but alas in the following year we had to quit to allow the Civil Defence to take possession This meant looking for other accommodation to keep the flag flying, but it was not so easy until our smiling W.Bro. Sidney Emberson came to our aid by offering the use of his large front room over his shop at Chadwell Heath, without charge for lighting heat etc. It was home from home for always on arrival that genial wife of Sidney had the kettle boiling to provide a cup of cheer to those who had come straight down from Town. It was also in this room in 1940 that the Brethren decided to apply for a collecting box on behalf of the Masonic Hospital, and the same box is still in use at the Lodge of Instruction. In 1945 the Lodge of Instruction was formed with its meeting place the Coopers Arms with W.Bro J. A. Mallard, as Secretary and W.Bro. H. E. Stratton, as Preceptor and the work they have carried out here is shown in the team work that we see in the Lodge today. When the committee was formed they decided to have a general Charity box as well as the Hospital box, up to date the Samaritan fund of the Royal Masonic Hospital, has received over £100 whilst the second box has donated about the same amount to other Masonic and Local Charities.
